

Meet Ms. McFarland

Along with Mr. Dixon, I would also like to introduce myself and welcome new students and families to TMS and welcome back last year's students, along with their families. The 2018-2019 school year will be my 12th in education and 4th as the middle school's assistant principal. I have spent my entire professional career at TMS. Prior to moving into an administrative role, I was an intervention specialist for 8 years. I have enjoyed using that experience in shaping how I approach situations and help students both academically and behaviorally. I very much enjoy getting to know our students, not only on an academic level, but also learning about their hobbies and interests. Witnessing our students' growth over the three years they are with us is always full of excitement and pride. I look forward to what this new school year will bring and building positive relationships with students and families.

R-Factor

At TMS we are promoting the R-Factor with students and staff again this year to continue to grow individuals not only as learners but also as impactful leaders. The R-Factor focuses on the simple formula $E+R=O$; E is an Event often out of our control, R is the Response that we do control which equals the O or Outcome. R-Factor also focuses on Above the Line and Below the Line behaviors. Above the Line behavior is intentional, on purpose and skillful. The opposite behavior is Below the Line. It is impulsive, on autopilot and resistant. As a building we are working to improve our "R"s and use Above the Line behavior to be successful.

The R-Factor theory was developed by Tim Kight and his Focus3 Company. Tecumseh Local Employees were able to see Mr. Kight at an In-service Day in September. We are working to get staff and students on board with the R-Factor to impact the culture of our community. We are working to be relentless to eliminate BCD behavior (Don't Blame, Complain or Defend) because it has never solved a problem, achieved a goal, or improved a relationship. We are on a journey to change our behaviors; we are focused on solutions and how to respond to challenges. It is much more difficult to take ownership and commit to being part of a solution. As always we cannot do this alone, so join the community and be a change agent for R-Factor!

OneView Parent Forms

If you are not aware, the Tecumseh Local School District moved from paper forms to online registration last school year. All of the district's annual information forms which were previously sent home on the first day of school are to be completed online through the OneView Parent Portal located on the Tecumseh Local Website.

If you do not have a device or the Internet in your home, you may visit any school in the district to use a computer to complete the enrollment process. You can also complete the process from home by accessing the OneView link on the right side of the district's website homepage. Please complete this process as soon as possible.

Note: Students who have not had their information electronically submitted through OneView will not be permitted to go on any field trips, as we do not have updated emergency medical information.

Progress Book

If you haven't checked your child's grades using the parent access Progress Book, it is a terrific tool for checking to see if they are being successful in class. You can access the site from the Tecumseh Local Website. The login and password is the same as last year. If you have any questions, please call the guidance office.

Arrival, Dismissal and Safety Procedures

Traffic issues at TMS have improved drastically since our first day of school. When dropping students off in the morning, we ask that you please pull along the front curb. To help with traffic congestion, we ask that you pull as far forward as traffic flow will allow. This help with a safer and more efficient process. Please refrain from allowing students to walk across the parking lot or through the lanes of traffic. Students can be dropped off as early as 7:00. The tardy bell rings at 7:20.

Our dismissal procedures are improving but we still ask for your patience as we keep our focus on student safety. Please do not ask your child to walk across traffic during dismissal. Ideally we would appreciate if students were picked up by the curb. If you cannot pick up your child along the curb because of traffic congestion, we ask that you park and walk to the crosswalk to ensure the well being of students.

Finally, we remind you that all doors are locked during the school day with the exception of the outside front doors. To enter the building during the school day, you must enter the office through the front doors. In accordance with safety measures in the district, TMS will require all guests to “buzz” into the office once inside the foyer doors. Look for the Big Yellow Arrow on the wall to the right of the office door. As always, parents will still need to present a photo ID in order to sign out a student.

Lockers

All students have been assigned a locker by the guidance office. It is important that lockers be kept locked at all times. Books, book bags, supplies and coats should be kept in your locker. Students should not allow another student to keep items in their locker. Students should not give out their combination lock to anyone. Lockers are property of the Tecumseh Local District.

Accelerated Reading Program (A.R.)

Accelerated Reading is an important part of our Reading program at 6th, 7th and 8th grades. Students read books at their individual reading levels and take a multiple choice computerized test to check comprehension. Each grade level will send home specific expectations for their students.

Our program has been updated and most books are included in the A.R. program. Books may be selected from our school library, the New Carlisle Public Library, classrooms, or home. Many books from our school library or the New Carlisle Public Library are already labeled with A.R. information such as reading level and the number of points the book is worth. If your child wants to read a book that is not labeled with A.R. information, please check the book level at www.arbookfind.com **BEFORE** your child reads the book. If no information is available, the book is not a part of the A.R. program and will not count toward A.R. goals.

Most books available to purchase through Scholastic book orders or book fairs are included in the A.R. program. This is an inexpensive way to purchase books for your child to read!

Arrow Expectations for Behavior

At Tecumseh Middle School we are continuing to promote positive behavior through our Arrow Expectations initiatives. Arrow Expectations is best explained as having common sets of expectations in our common areas such as hallways, cafeteria, and restrooms that encourage students to be on their best behavior. DIRECTORY INFORMATION

Annual Public Notice

Each year the Superintendent shall provide public notice to students and their parents of our intent to make available, upon request, certain information known as "directory information." The Board designates as student "directory information": a student's name; address; telephone number; date and place of birth; major field of study; participation in officially-recognized activities and sports; height and weight, if a member of an athletic team; dates of attendance; date of graduation; or awards received. This is our annual public notice. Directory information shall not be provided to any organization for profit-making purposes. Parents and eligible students may refuse to allow the Board to disclose any or all of such "directory information" upon written notification to the Board within two (2) weeks after receipt of the Superintendent's annual public notice.

Whenever consent of the parent(s)/eligible student is required for the inspection and/or release of a student's health or educational records or for the release of "directory information," either parent may provide such consent unless agreed to otherwise in writing by both parents or specifically stated by court order. If the student is under the guardianship of an institution, the Superintendent shall appoint a person who has no conflicting interest to provide such written consent. The Board may disclose "directory information" on former students without student or parental consent. The Board shall not permit the collection, disclosure, or use of personal information collected from students for the purpose of marketing or for selling that information (or otherwise providing that information to others for that purpose).

Emergency Closings

In case of emergencies or inclement weather, which would necessitate the closing of school, information will be given to the following radio and TV stations:
