WHEREAS, beginning in the 2014-2015 school year, school districts must comply with minimum hours of instruction instead of a minimum number of school days

reasons specified in section 3313.482 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, ORC 3313.482 authorizes a local board of education the ability to approve an annual plan by August 1 of each year to provide online learning opportunities for students in lieu of attendance on such days of closure; and

WHEREAS, the Tecumseh Local School District Board of Education authorizes the Superintendent to cancel District scheduled waiver days to make up for calamity day time.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT, AND IT IS, HEREBY RESOLVED that the Tecumseh Local School District Board of Education hereby approves the following plan and authorizes its filing with the Ohio Department of Education.

PLAN FOR ON-LINE ALTERNATIVE MAKE-UP OF CALAMITY DAYS

Section 1. Pursuant to Ohio Revised Code section 3313.482, the Board of Education of the Tecumseh Local School District hereby authorizes the following plan to allow students of the District to access and complete classroom lessons posted on the District's Google Classroom Platform where available through distance learning in order to make up any number of days or hours necessary to meet the state-required minimums due to the mandated closure of school buildings.

- 1. This plan includes the written consent of the teachers' employee representative as designated under division (B) of section 4117.04. Such consent is on file in the official file of the Board of Education and is hereby incorporated into this plan as if specifically rewritten.
- 2. In the event that all hours of instruction are exhausted for the school year 2024-2025, to the extent possible, each classroom teacher shall develop and/or use District created materials containing a sufficient number of lessons for each course taught by that teacher representing the amount of instructional time the student would receive for three school days in such a teacher's class.
- 3. To the extent possible, the District will provide teacher-directed synchronous learning via the Google Classroom Platform in which the teacher and students are interacting in real time during the closure.
- 4. Student attendance and learning opportunities will be recorded via the student learning platform by recording present and absent students at the required start of the school day. Teachers and administrators will utilize on-line tools to reach out to students to ensure engagement during the closure.
- 5. Equitable access to quality instruction will be ensured, using on-line tools and the presence, to the extent possible, of qualified staff members to meet the needs of students with disabilities, English learners, and other vulnerable student populations.

- 6. Staff, students, and parents will be notified via Parent Square that the school will utilize online delivery of instruction.
- 7. Teachers will be available via electronic mail and the virtual learning platform during the closure.
- 8. Staff and student internet connectivity and technology for online delivery of instruction will be provided by the District, to the extent possible.
- 9. This plan shall provide for making up any number of hours, up to a maximum of the number of hours that are the equivalent of three school days.

Section 2. The Board hereby finds and determines that all formal actions related to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in open meetings of this Board; and that all deliberations of this Board and of its committees, which resulted in formal action, were taken in meetings open to the public or otherwise held in accordance with permissible executive session meetings and in full compliance with applicable law.

Section 3. This Resolution shall be in full force for the 2024-2025 school year only
