While earning her Bachelor of Science degree with majors in mathematics and physical education at Wilmington College, Sue participated in intercollegiate sports. Though limited in the sports offered for women, she played basketball, various intramural groups, and softball. Participation in the Cincinnati Recreational League, would lead Sue to the World Tournament in Richmond Virginia, losing to the world champs. Attending school year round through a work study program with the Randall Company in Wilmington, Sue made time to be a member of Delta Omega Theta Sorority, held several offices and refereed high school girls basketball games in Clinton, Warren, and Hamilton counties.

She married her high school sweetheart and classmate, James M. Crowe, THS '56. They resided in Angola, Indiana, where Sue taught Physical Education at Angola High School. While there, she also sponsored the cheerleaders and the Girls Athletic Association.
