GPA/Class Rank

A 4.0 scale is used in determining GPA and class rank. GPA is based on the semester averages of academic courses. Advanced Placement and honors courses are weighted using a 5.0=A, 4.0=B, 3.0=C, and 1.0=D. Some college credit plus courses (CCP) are weighted as well. All courses except physical education classes and Yearbook are included in the GPA. The final rank is computed after graduation and placed on the student's transcript.

Graduation Requirements:

A minimum of 21 credits including all required courses, as specified, and earn competency scores on the Algebra I and English II end-of-course exams, and earn two graduation seals.
