



## Park Layne Elementary Students Enjoy New Reading Garden

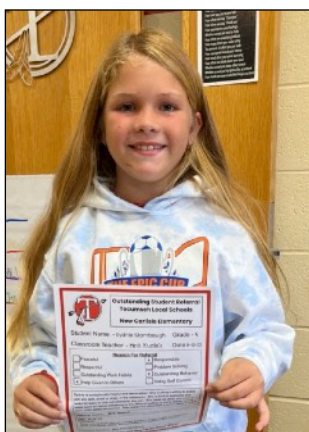
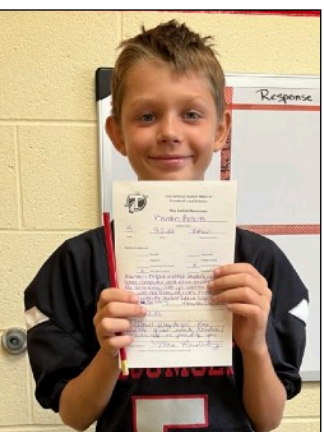
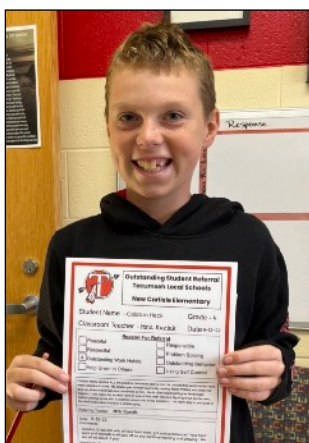
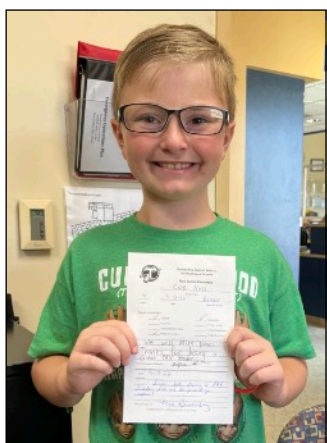
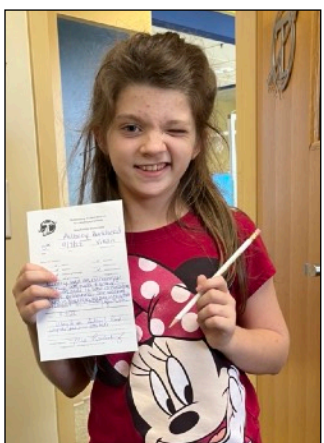
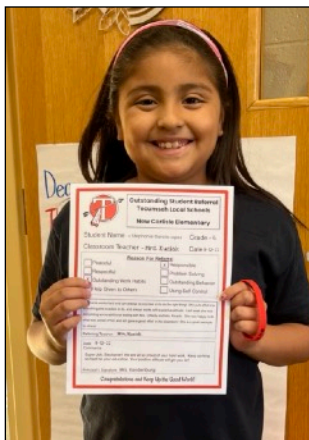
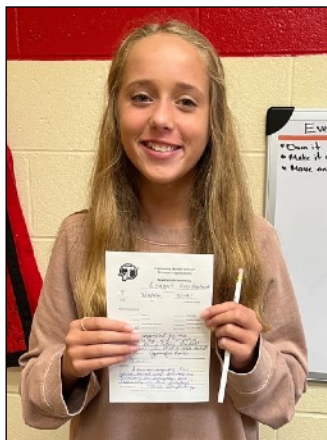
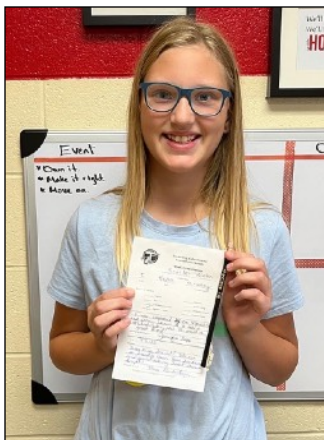

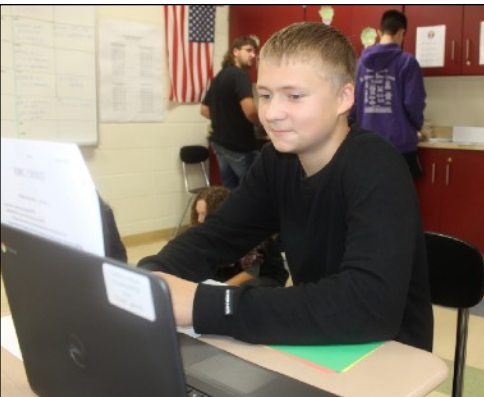
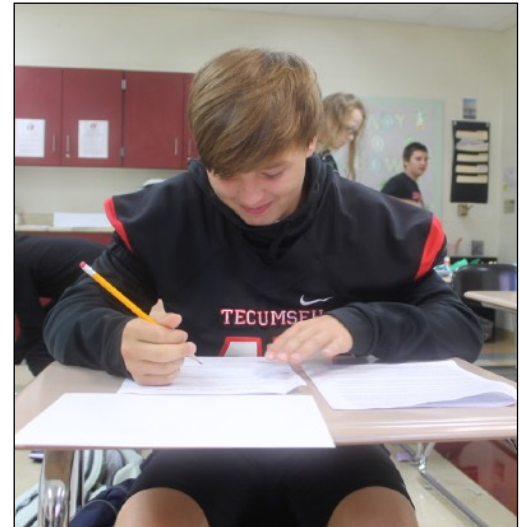






## Freshmen English Classes Express Their Creativity

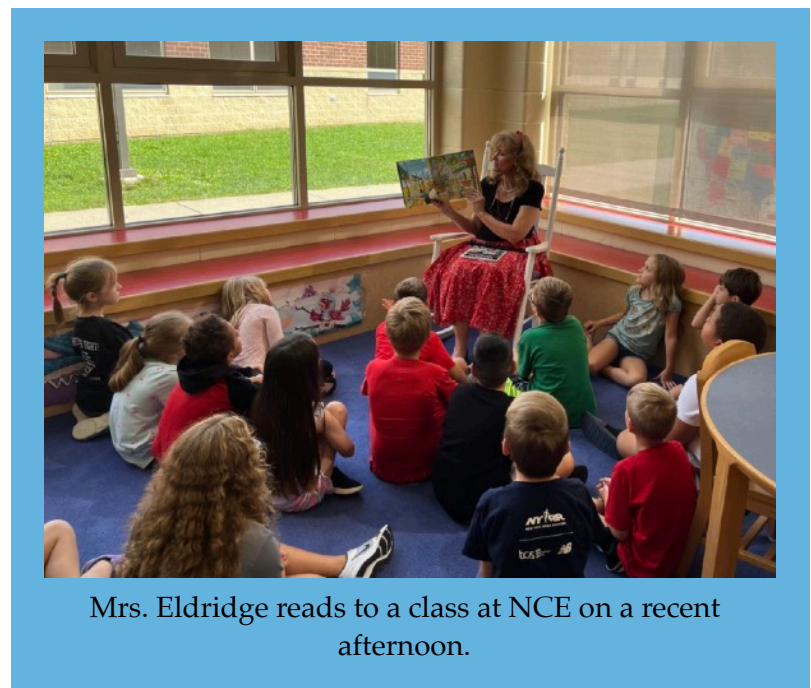






## Students Enjoy Library Time Throughout the District

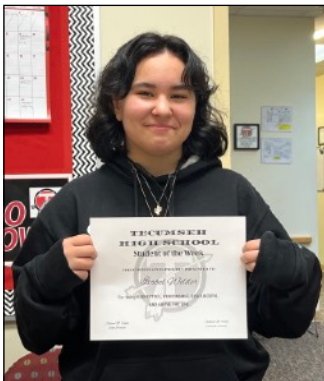
