Communications

Aaron Oakes - Pathways to Graduation: The Class of 2022 is the last to operate under old requirements. The requirements for 2023 and beyond is a three-step process. Step 1 - Credits. 21 or more credits are required, broken down as follows: English 4, Math 4. Science 3, Social Studies 3, Health ½, PE ½, Personal Finance ½, and Electives 5½. Step 2 - Competency. Two end-of-course exams Algebra I and English II, need a 684 or better. This has been lowered recently, which has helped students obtain that competency level. Test can be retaken, four days of remediation and then test on the 5th day. College Credit Plus class can be taken for either Algebra I or English II, need a B or better. Or you can obtain Industry credentials, requires 12 points. Point value varies widely. Or Military readiness will also satisfy Step 2, must have a signed contract with the military that you are enlisting after high school. Step 3 - Readiness. Students must earn a minimum of two graduation seals, one of which can be one of the three locally defined seals, Community Service, Fine and Performing Arts, and Student Engagement. Looking at potential to adapt the locally defined seals to better suit our students. State defined seals are OhioMeansJobs Readiness, Industry-Recognized Credential, College-Ready Seal, Military Enlistment, Citizenship, Science, Honors Diploma, Biliteracy, and Technology.

Nikki Williams - in regard to the Rise Up Program, asked if there would there be a

downfall to offering this to our Freshmen and Sophomores to pursue these classes earlier, so they would be prepared in advance.
