Planning and Discussion

The Board of Education, New Carlisle City officials, Bethel Township trustees and representatives of Clark County and state representatives conducted a joint meeting to discuss the following topics:

Bethel Township:

June 9th – Clean-Up Day

Bethel Twp. Fire Chief informed the group that Bethel Twp. has two new Lucas devices for cardiac arrest victims.

State approve new state fire code that contains some significant changes.

New Carlisle:

NC Fire Chief stated that New Carlisle has a 3 mill levy on the ballot May 8th for capital purchase and salaries.

Free band concert on May 5th at Smith Park.

June 16th – Clean-Up Day

Wot-a-Dog is opened under new management and business has been good.

This year will be the 50th anniversary of the pool.

Tecumseh Local:

New Carlisle Library is proposing a .7 mill levy for operations and would like the district to be the flow-thru public entity.

The district will be contracting with the Clark County Sheriff for a School Resource Officer to be housed at the high school this fall.

Tecumseh Local will be partnering with OSBA this summer to prepare a strategic plan for the district.

The district has 112 students who attend the Springfield-Clark CTC.

Clark County Commissioners:

Commissioner McGlothin spoke about the county land bank. The commissioners are working hard on economic development for the county and a strategic plan. The Commission is still working on a combined 911 system with the City of Springfield.

Clark County Auditor:

2019 property re-evaluations are taking place.

Greater gas pump presence in New Carlisle. Don't use debit cards at the pumps.

Tax Review Committee – Property tax assessment vs. just sales tax.

State Representative – Kyle Koehler:

HB 123 – Payday Lending - \$75 million on fees leave the State of Ohio.

HB 512 – Combined ODE and IHE – probably will not go anywhere.

No Gun Issue – it's a mental health issue.

Public Comments:

Ed Dow asked questions of Representative Koehler regarding Issue I and of Commissioner McGlothin regarding the boat races.

Residents of Tillie Lane addressed the township trustees and commissioners regarding Jackson Creek and the need for it to be cleaned up.

Sam George commented that he was thrilled about the district's new SRO but commented that Sidney City Schools hire retired police officers which is more efficient.

Next meeting was set for July 30, 2018 at 6:30 p.m. and Bethel Township will host.
