Reynolds Roof Replacement at Tecumseh High School

Ms. Martin moved and Mrs. Scott seconded to approve a contract with Garland/DBS & Maxim, Inc. for the replacement of the roof (KEE with densdeck) on Reynolds Gym at Tecumseh High School for the amount of \$359,864 (20-year warranty). The current roof over Reynolds Gym was installed in 2006. Since 2015 we have spent the following amounts on repairs of the roof:

The repair work listed above totals \$82,213 before the resealing could be done last year, at a cost of \$645,000; for a total of \$727,213 since 2015.

We did not get a quote on the EPDM roof or TPO roof based on product availability. There are districts in the area that use a modified roof like we presented at the last meeting. This time we are presenting the KEE roof with densdeck which would help elongate the time

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between repairs. Springfield is using KEE. Garland is a company who we have done business with for 25 years, and our consultant who has been with Garland for 15 years. Our consultant is not paid by Tecumseh, he is paid through Garland. Springfield City, Clark County ESC, Clark County CTC, Greenon, and Clark Shawnee all use Garland. Garland is part of Omni Consortium, which has requirements in order to be included. Best practice is to go through a consortium for bidding.

Planning and Discussion

- Susan Wile - New Intervention Specialist at New Carlisle Elementary School, thanked Paula and the board for adding that position. 2019 ended with 651 students needing intervention. An Intervention Specialist can serve between 8-24 kids depending on what role they are fulfilling. Most Intervention Specialists can serve 16 kids by law and cannot exceed that number. We are at 692 kids now on IEPs! Very happy to secure the hiring of 2 school psychologists. Two Speech Therapists are still needed. Montgomery County ESC covered 4 days out of 5 for the vacancy left by Karen Krogg, part way through the year, Clark County ESC was able to cover the other 1 day out of 5. Clark County ESC has assured us they will be able to cover both of our open positions for the 2022-2023 school year. Migrant Summer School is up and running, we have 12 students K-12. Historically we have had higher enrollment. We have about 50 students who are eligible.
- Beth Moore - provided information on student growth, and projected growth for the next 3 years. Update given on Summer Learning Program. Enrollment is not what we anticipated, we have 127 elementary students, and 30 middle school students. Elementary attendance is 94.3%, while middle school is 77%. Staff reductions were made to be fiscally responsible.
- Brian Dixon - working with Deputy Loney on Threat Assessment program being offered through the Attorney General's office. A lot of this are things that we have already been doing. Parking Lot paving going well, paving portion should be completed by the end of the week. ADA Guidelines / non-compliance with handicap parking. A-Z will stripe some of the spaces, including van-accessible spots, 7 spaces in total. Auction last week was successful with \$5,600 in gross sales, 12% commission plus advertising fees.
- Deputy Loney - attended SRO Conference, 400 in attendance, predicting 600 by next year. STEM now wants their own SRO, as will the ESC. Updating safety plans throughout the district along with Brian. HB215 went into effect this week. No real change to the schools. Firearms are still not permitted on property.
