# August 10, 2021

The Tecumseh Local Board of Education met in regular session on August 10, 2021 with board president Corinne Scott presiding. Mrs. Scott called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. The meeting was held in the Arrow Conference Room at Tecumseh High School, 9830 W. National Road, New Carlisle, Ohio 45344.

## Minutes of Previous Meetings

#### Communications

Written Communications – None at this time. Other Communications – None at this time. Reports:

- Paula Crew, Superintendent, presented information on how Tecumseh is opening for the 2021-2022 school year. All health mandates are lifted, masks and facial coverings are optional. We will have full-time in-person learning for all. There are no mandates or health orders in place at this time. CDC requires masks on all public transportation however Tecumseh does not agree that a school bus is public transportation. Hand sanitizer will continue to be available, and students may bring their own if they choose. Water fountains will be available, students are encouraged to bring their own water bottles. Ventilation has been a focus over the past several months and improvements have been made to increase circulation. Even though the buildings are newer, there were some adjustments that were able to be made, at minimal cost, to improve the quality of the air in our buildings. Covid quarantine procedures were reviewed. Our nurses will be meeting with the health department. We have a vaccine clinic scheduled this Thursday from 4-6. Opening day for our staff is this Monday at 8:00 a.m. in the auditorium. Breakfast and lunch will continue to be free this year for all students. We will encourage our parents to fill out applications for free and reduced meals for two reasons, fees can be waived for those families who qualify for free meals, and a lot of our federal grants are based on the percentage of families in our district who qualify for free and reduced meals. We want to have the most accurate information available in order to receive the highest available amount of funding. Our first home football game is September 3, which will be First Responder Appreciation Night. The evening will end with fireworks that have been completely funded by outside donations from local businesses and residents.
- Veronica Cassidy, Technology Coordinator thanked the board for their continued support of technology at Tecumseh and recognized the computer techs in the department: UB Ottley, Jenny Riffle, and Andi Circle. Technology has changed greatly over the past year. With grants

and Cares Act funding we have been able to purchase a device for every student. Teachers made great gains in their usage and knowledge of technology. We have a new inventory system and help desk system. We have spare devices in each building now in the event a student forgets their device, or it is out for repairs. We have migrated to Final Forms and are no longer using OneView for our on-line enrollment/registration. Secretaries have received training and find it much easier to navigate than OneView. Parents with children in sports at Tecumseh were already using Final Forms. Parent Square is our new communication tool that will be utilized this year. It will give teachers an easier way to communicate with parents. Communications can be translated into Spanish to send to families, and Spanish responses from parents will translate back to English for the teacher. There are lots of exciting projects coming up in the Technology Department. T-Tech technology training will be back in person this year for our staff. It's a great way to increase knowledge among our staff.

• Beth Moore, Curriculum Coordinator reported back on the Summer Learning Program. Our attendance percentages were good, and above the national average for summer school. At the elementary level, 86% of the students showed adequate growth and the middle school 81% showed adequate growth. The older the grade, the harder it is to make big jumps. The high school results will not be available until testing results are returned. Overall, the summer Learning Program was a big success for Tecumseh.

#### **Public Comments:**

- Megan Cuy Castellanos thanked the board for making masks optional this year. She also cited various studies on the effectiveness of masks, and the transmission rate of Covid among the young.
- Kerry Cassell gave kudos to everyone involved with summer school. Dawn Cooper and Amy Moore did a great job, and the kids were excited to be there.
- Larry Fry gave a copy of a message he sent to Governor DeWine regarding Critical Race Theory. Beth Moore spoke to the fact that Critical Race Theory is not in any of the curriculum being taught at Tecumseh. We teach to the standards set forth by the State of Ohio.
- Heather Chappel claims that Critical Race Theory is in our schools. Referenced an email signature from a teacher with a link that takes you to a gender-neutral website that she discussed at the last meeting as well as a series of questions on Edmentum that were solely based on race.
- Chanel Davis stated that you are servants of the taxpayers and not the state. Since two large
  teacher unions have come out in support of mandated vaccines for teachers, asked if we will
  be mandating vaccines for teachers. Mrs. Crew replied that at this time there is no intention
  to mandate anything for anyone.
- Sam George spoke on CRT and state curriculum. Beth Moore reiterated that the state sets the
  standards that must be taught, and the districts choose the curriculum. Mr. George went on to
  site Resolution 20 that has CRT in it. It was approved by the State School Board July 14. He
  feels the board should look into Resolution 20 to see how that might be embedded in the
  requirements set by the state.
- Kerry Cassell, Union President, teacher, parent, and resident. Teachers do make medical decisions every day regarding their students, do they need a bandage, how bad is their headache, etc. we don't claim to be medical professionals, we want to teach. As far as what teachers teach, we are bound by the state standards. The board approves the curriculum. All of our standards are on our district website. It's all available to whoever wants to look at it.

She has sat through meetings with the OEA President who has said that CRT is not a K-12 issue, it's a college level law class issue. Regarding teachers and vaccines, the vaccine was offered to all teachers back in March and it is everyone's choice as to whether to receive it or not. The same is true with masks, it is everyone's personal choice.
