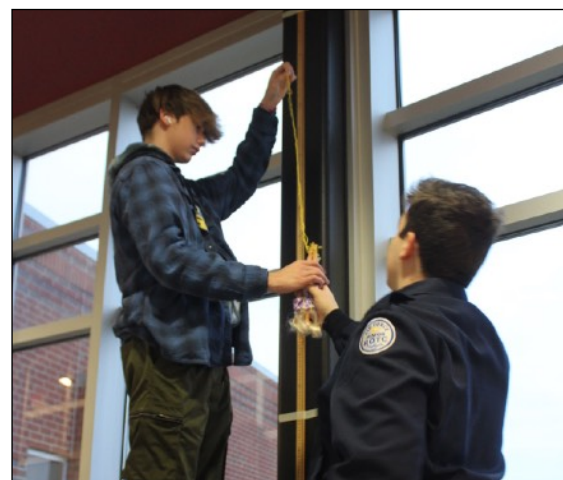
Tecumseh Middle School Career Cafe Explores CTC Programs

Tecumseh High School Students of the Week for January 2



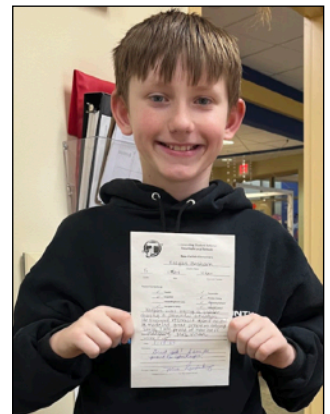
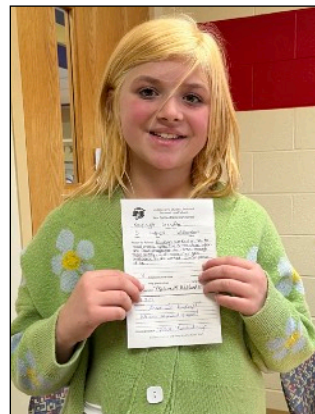

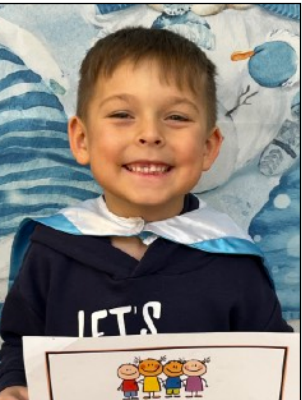
