Animal and Plant Science Class Conducts Experiment

Students in Mr. Vehorn's Animal and Plant Science class experimented with how different liquids (water, vinegar & corn syrup) would affect both the shell and inside of eggs submerged in the liquid for 24 hours or more. At the start of the experiment, the class discussed how the shell is porous and allows oxygen to enter and carbon dioxide to escape as a chick develops in a fertilized egg. In some cases the shell disappeared (with the vinegar) and in others (with the water) the size of the egg increased. With the corn syrup the egg decreased in size as the water was drawn out of it. The class examined and compared all of the different eggs and discussed how the age of the eggs could also factor into various changes occurring.

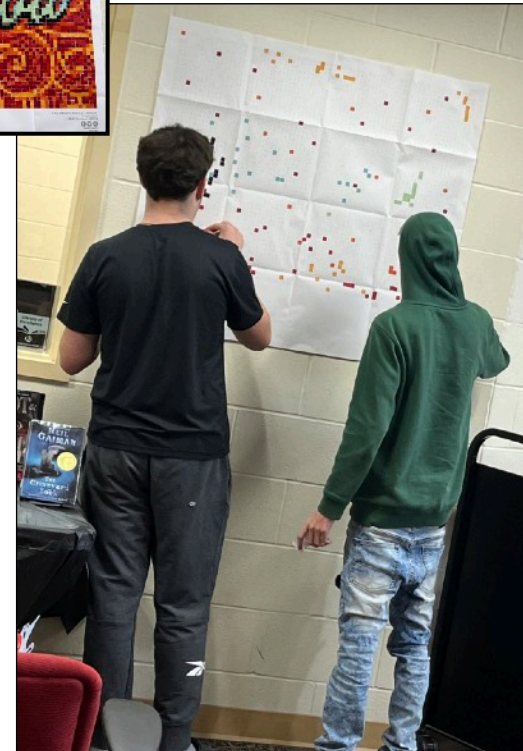
