NCE Summer Readers enjoy an ice cream party as a reward for their work over the summer.



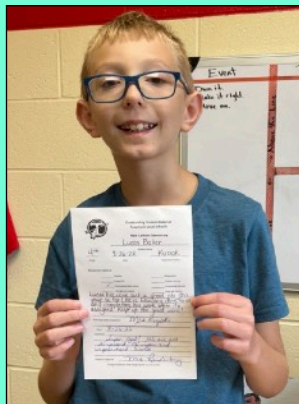
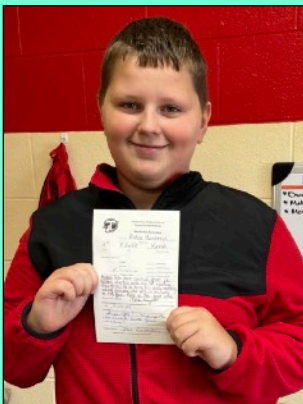


Beginning of 2022-23 School Year Has Lots Going On

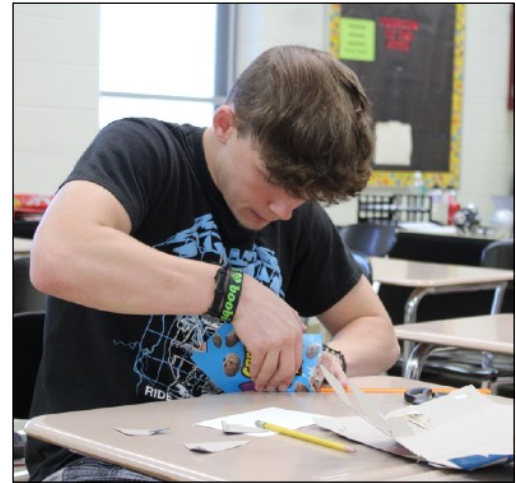
