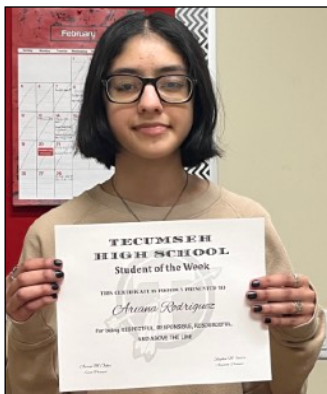
THS Holds Food Packing Event to Benefit Southern African Country

Working with Wittenberg University, the THS Student Council held an event February 23 where 40 volunteers packed thousands of nutrition packets to be sent to Lesotho, a small country in southern Africa. The event took place February 23 and volunteers packed over 16,500 meals. Lesotho is a country of just over 2 million people and has an estimated 360,000 orphans. Also, an estimated 550,000 children face severe malnutrition and stunting. Each packet the volunteers put together contains 6 meals and costs only 15¢.

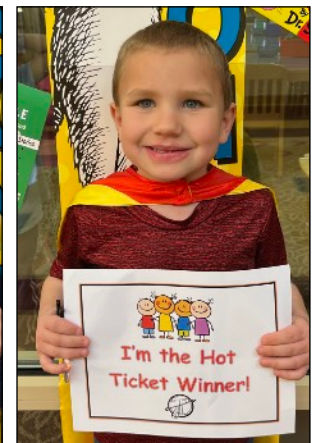
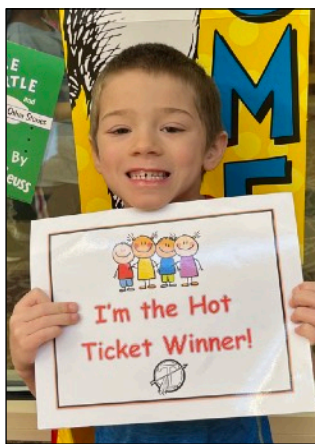
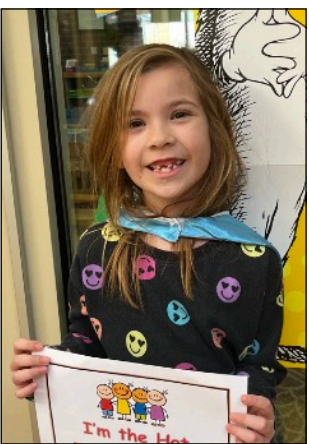
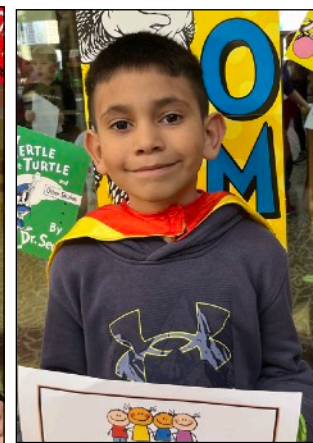
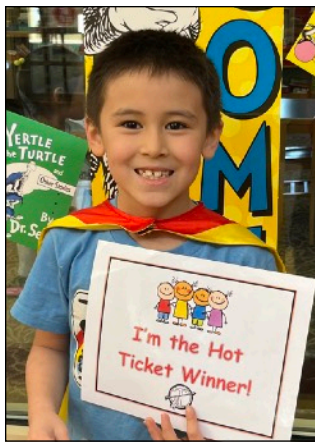
Sixth Grade Choir Performs Mini-Musical For Park Layne Elementary
