

COLLEGE CREDIT PLUS

- Wittenberg is a proud participant in the State of Ohio's College Credit Plus (CCP) program
- This program allows qualified high school students to take college-level courses on campus
- Wittenberg offers a variety of academic courses that students can take

- As long as you earn a C or higher in your CCP coursesthey count for credits at Wittenberg





Program Admission Requirements

TAKING COURSES AT WITTENBERG

- Demonstrate readiness to take college level courses by exemplifying:
 - Good student conduct
 - Satisfactory grades
 - Minimum standardized test scores
- Submit a recommendation from High School Guidance Counselor
- Recommended required High School GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Standardized Test Scores Requirements
 - Wittenberg accepts ACT, SAT or Accuplacer test scores
 - Scores must meet the required score threshold
- Note: Wittenberg classes in mathematics, science and foreign language will require completion of an online placement test



How to Apply for CCP at Wittenberg


APPLYING FOR CCP

- Step 1: Apply online- ccp.wittenberg.edu
 - When applying use your school email and a simplified password
- Step 2: Students should notify their high school counselor of their intentions to participate in Wittenberg's College Credit Plus Program
- Step 3: Submit application, counselor recommendation, high school transcript along with necessary test scores
- Step 4: If admitted to Wittenberg for CCP, students will register for classes through Jenna Unterseher, associate registrar at Wittenberg



College Credit Plus (CCP) portal






CCP Program Cost/Fees

COST OF CCP

- For public school, private and homeschooled students approved by the state,
 tuition and book fees for CCP are paid for by the state
- For private/homeschooled students not covered by state funding, Wittenberg charges \$166 per CCP credit
- Wittenberg will not charge additional tuition or fees
- Check with your guidance counselor before purchasing text books

Frequently Asked Questions about CCP

What benefits do I get from taking CCP classes?

College Credit Plus provides more options for students to pursue rigorous academic coursework beyond the high school classroom. Under College Credit Plus, you can complete your freshman year of college or more or explore college content that interests you. Earning college credits while you're in high school can reduce the time and cost of attending college after high school, or allow for lighter college semester loads—helpful if you plan to participate in college athletics or study abroad.

I have taken CCP classes at Clark State Community College. Can I transfer those classes to Wittenberg?

Yes! In order to transfer completed coursework from another college or university, you will need to request an official transcript be sent to Wittenberg University for evaluation. Classes must be completed with a "C" or higher in order to count for transfer credit.

How might CCP classes taken at Clark State Community College help me at Wittenberg?

Coursework completed at another college or university can sometimes fulfill prerequisites needed at Wittenberg. For example, if you successfully completed English 101 at another institution, you can transfer this course to Wittenberg and it will fulfill the prerequisite for any Wittenberg course requiring the previous completion of English 101.

Do I have to complete Wittenberg placement exams if I have already taken the COMPASS placement exam at Clark State Community College?

Yes. If you are interested in taking a Math, Science, or Foreign Language course at Wittenberg, you must complete the Wittenberg placement exam(s). Note: In some cases, we can accept your SAT/ACT math score in place of the math placement exam. For more information, visit the Math Workshop website.

Do I have to take a standardize test in order to be eligible to participate in the CCP program?

Yes. According to House Bill 49, all students applying to participate in the CCP program must complete a standardize test and submit his or her scores to the schools they wish to attend.

If I go to a public high school, how can I know how many credits I am eligible to take thru the CCP program?

In order to determine the number of credit hours a student can take in a year, the secondary school must calculate the number of course credits that are for high school credit only and multiply that by 3. That number is then subtracted from the 30 hours. The result is the maximum number of credit hours a student can take in the College Credit Plus program. (This is based on a semester system.)

30 – (high school only credits x 3) = Maximum number of College Credit Plus credit hours

This calculation must be completed each year for a student as the high school credits may change. Also, students may only take a maximum of 120 credit hours in the program. If students would like to take more than the maximum number of credit hours, the student can arrange to register and pay for those additional credit hours as a "self-pay" student. Those hours would be outside of the College Credit Plus program.

What happens if I take more than the number of credit hours approved by the state?

High school students may choose to enroll in more credits than approved by the state. In these cases, students will be billed directly by Wittenberg University the CCP rate of \$166 per credit.
