COLLEGE CREDIT PLUS AT WRIGHT STATE UNIVERSITY

College Credit Plus (CCP) is a great way to save time and money on the cost of a college degree. At Wright State, CCP students can complete college-level coursework and prepare for the rigors of college classes. Students who successfully complete CCP courses will earn college credit that can apply toward a Wright State degree or be transferred to another Ohio public college or university.

Please discuss your interest in CCP with your high school counselor. A letter of intent to participate in CCP should be submitted to your high school.

TO ENROLL IN CCP

- 1. Complete and submit the College Credit Plus Application at wright.edu/apply.
- 2. Submit official high school transcripts.
- 3. Complete assessment tests if required (see below).
- 4. Submit permission slip and student questionnaire

TEST SCORE AND PLACEMENT ASSESSMENT REQUIREMENTS

Requirements may change based on pending Ohio legislation. Visit wright.edu/CCP-enrollment for the most up-to-date information.

Students in grades 10, 11, and 12

You can be admitted to Wright State without test scores if you have an unweighted 3.0 or higher cumulative GPA.

- Students enrolling in an English composition course will be placed based on the following:
 - High school GPA of 3.2 or higher can be placed into ENG1100
 - High school GPA of 2.9–3.1 can be placed into ENG1140

Students in grades 7, 8, and 9

You are required to submit ACT or SAT scores or complete our writing and math placement assessments.

Any student who has below an unweighted 3.0 cumulative GPA is required to submit ACT or SAT scores or complete our writing and math placement assessments.

CCP COURSE OPTIONS

CCP students are eligible to enroll in courses from the Wright State Academic Catalog which meet House Bill 49 requirements and for which they meet all course prerequisites. Ohio's First 15 Rule requires students to complete 15 credit hours of Level I courses before progressing to Level II courses.

Level I courses may be:

- A transferable course—part of Career-Technical Assurance Guides (CTAG), Ohio Transfer 36, or Transfer Assurance Guides (TAG) or equivalent at private college/university
- Course in computer science, information technology, anatomy, physiology, or foreign language, including American Sign Language
- Technical certificate course
- 15-credit-hour or 30-credit-hour model pathway course
- Study skills, academic, or career success skills course
- Internship course
- Another course that may be approved by the Chancellor on an annual basis

Exceptions to the First 15 Rule may be made if the student wishes to continue with a course in the same subject or tests directly into a Level II course. Students who have met the required scores on AP or IB course examinations may apply the course toward their first 15 credit hours.

Level II courses may be:

Any other college course that is not considered Level I, except:

- One-on-one private instruction course
- Course with fees that exceed an amount set by the Chancellor
- Study abroad course
- Physical education course
- Course that awards P/F or S/U grades (unless the course is an internship or is a transferable course for all students enrolled)
- Remedial course
- Sectarian religion course
