Mission Statement: Tecumseh Local Schools is the driving force behind a community of diverse and proudly connected Arrows. We are relentless learners who strive to become better tomorrow than we were today.

Federal Funding



Tecumseh Local Schools, along with most school districts, received federal funding in response to the COVID - 19 Pandemic. This funding, titled the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Funding (ESSER), is restricted. Restricted funding requires that a district budget this funding in specific areas. Twenty percent of this funding needs to be used to recover from the learning loss realized from the pandemic. The funding can be used to supplant salaries of existing staff members as well. Below are the areas in which we have utilized or will utilize this funding.

- **Summer Learning Program** - The district offered a Summer Learning program this past summer (2021) for students in grades K-12. We plan to use this funding to offer a Summer Learning Program for 2022 and 2023 as well.

- **Curriculum, assessments, materials and supplies** - These were and will be used to support learning and growth during the school year and with the Summer Learning Programs.
- **Staff and student devices** - Our district was able to become a one-to-one, student to device ratio, with this funding. Additional ESSER funding is earmarked to upkeep and purchase devices to maintain the one-to-one ratio for the next several years.
- **Virtual teacher(s) during the 2020-2021 school year** - This supported our students who elected to learn virtually.
- **Edmentum** - Software program used with student learning virtually during the 2020-2021 school year.
- **Professional Development** - Multiple opportunities for professional development have and will continue to be provided for our educational staff members.
- **Mental Health Therapist(s)** - TLS is contracting with the Clark County Mental Health Department for the services of three mental health therapists who work directly within the district.
- **Two full-time nurses** - TLS is contracting with the Clark County Educational Service Center for two school nurses. This ensures we have a full-time nurse at each of our buildings (K-12) to help navigate the nuances of the pandemic.
- **Personal protective equipment (PPE), cleaning supplies and equipment** - These items were purchased in conjunction with the recommendation of the CDC and OHD.
- **HVAC Systems** - Budgeted for chillers/boilers/quality water control.
- **Website and Communications Upgrade**
- **Salaries** - A portion of the ESSER funding is being used to offset funding coming from the general fund. This will extend the duration of time TLS has a positive carryover fund.

Water Tower Update - Brian Dixon, Director of Facilities & Safety

The water tower project at Tecumseh High School has currently been paused so that a bypass shutoff valve can be installed. This shutoff will allow the district to provide softened water when the tower is drained for recoating and painting or for future maintenance of the system. Towers are designed with bypass shutoff valves; however, this was not included when construction took place at Tecumseh. The EPA typically signs off on construction so it is unclear how this was missed. Needless to say, given the lack of available materials and labor shortages during the pandemic, the installation time has lengthened.

The current goal is that the bypass shutoff valve will be installed during September which will then allow for the painting and coating of the tower to begin in October. We continue to place a high priority on the safety of our water supply in the district and want to invest in its protection for future generations of students at Tecumseh Local Schools. Our water continues to be safe for consumption.

Tecumseh Middle School is thrilled to partner with Kona-Ice of Troy during the 2021-2022 school year. Kona-Ice has launched a Character Awards Program, where they want to recognize students who make positive choices. Kona-Ice Character Awards Program will be included in the existing PBIS program already in place at TMS.

Every month, on our scheduled two-hour delay days, TMS will have Kona-Ice Days. On Kona-Ice Days, students will have the opportunity to purchase Kona-Ice during their grade level's scheduled time. Every student will have the opportunity to purchase a Kona-Ice ranging from \$3-\$5. However, around 23 students from each grade level will be rewarded with a free Kona-Ice coupon that they have earned through making positive choices. 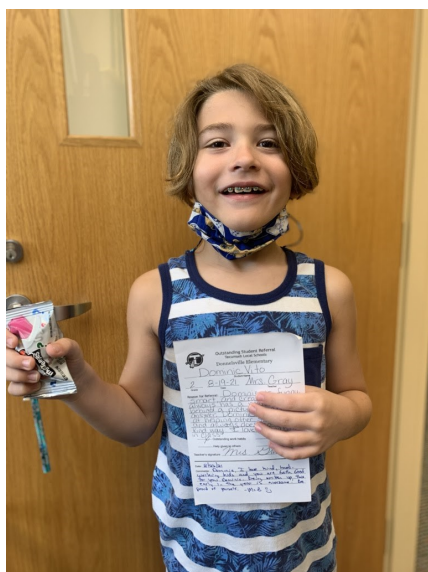
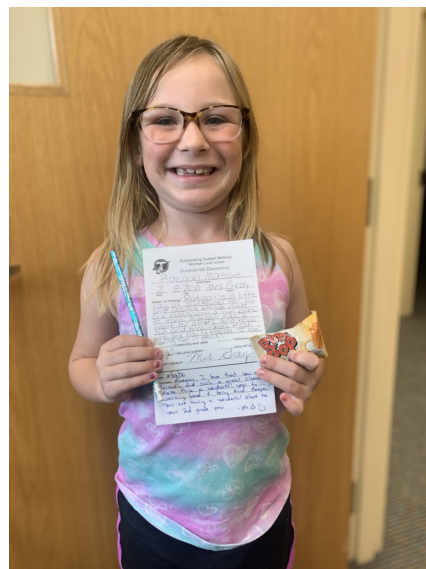


From Jay Burkholder, Donnelsville Elementary Principal

Bullying Assembly

On Friday, September 3, New Carlisle Elementary welcomed Deputy Josh Berner and Deputy Shaun Lisle who presented information to our students about bullying. Rather than holding a typical style assembly with the whole building, the deputies met with 4-5 classes at a time in the gym. The students enjoyed the presentation and learned the difference between a bully and a student being mean. Students also learned what to do if they are being bullied, how to tell, and how to respond. The presentation style worked very well and kept the students engaged. Each session ended with questions from the students. Students left feeling informed and empowered.

Please continue to talk to your children about how to be kind to others. It is really important to remind your child to use "I Statements" when talking with a bully or a student being mean, for example "I don't like it when..., It makes me feel..."

From Karyl Strader, Park Layne Elementary Principal

There are so many exciting things happening at Park Layne Elementary. First of all, a huge thank you to parents for helping your children adjust to a new school year or to school for the first time. The first few weeks of school are always difficult for our youngest Arrows, but students have really worked hard to learn all about being PAX leaders, following routines, making new friends, and so much more. Please help your children even more by making sure that they know how to do simple self-help tasks such as tying their shoes, fastening and zipping, and opening containers. Please take a few minutes to show your child how to open containers in their packed lunch and certainly have your child tie his/her own shoes each day with your help and support. This is the only way they'll learn. Please know that we are happy to help students but we want to teach them independence. They are so excited when they are able to do these tasks by themselves.

On the academic side, we have just finished assessing all students on early reading skills and are beginning our reading coaching groups this week. All students will be in a reading coaching group. Our neediest students will receive this support in a small group setting with a Title I staff member outside of their classroom for 40 minutes each day. Students who are performing a little higher academically in the area of reading will receive their reading coaching group instruction from their classroom teacher. Students who are in the classroom will likely have a coaching group of about 20 minutes and will work independently the other 20 minutes on reading skills. More information will be shared with parents during conferences on October 12 or 14th in regards to their child's reading level. Regardless of whether your child is in a coaching group with their classroom teacher or a Title I staff member, all students will bring home a bag each night. This bag, commonly referred to as a child's baggy book, will contain a leveled reading book, as well as a sight word list or a letter/sound list. Students should read their book to an adult each evening and practice either their letters, sounds, or sight words. This nightly practice makes a huge difference in a child's success in reading.

If you have any questions about your child's reading/coaching group, please reach out to your child's teacher. We look forward to the opportunity to talk with parents more about their child's reading at conferences on October 12 and 14th. Look for more information to come home from your child's teacher in regards to conferences if you have not already signed up.

Finally, please start talking to your child about what it means to be a PAX leader. The PAX Good Behavior Game program is used by every classroom teacher across the Tecumseh School District in grades K-5. PAX helps children learn to self-regulate their behavior. We encourage students to be PAX leaders. This just means that they are making good choices which lead to peace, productivity, health and happiness. We will share more information in the coming weeks and months and will even offer parent training on PAX tools parents can use at home. For now, just encourage students to be PAX leaders at home and at school.

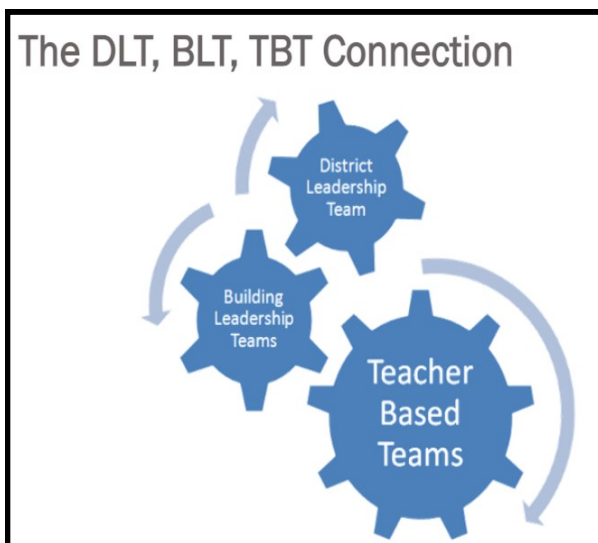
Park Layne students pictured here completed the Summer Reading Challenge by completing at least 500 minutes in the Lexia Computer program over the summer.

A System for Growth - Beth Moore, Curriculum Specialist

Tecumseh Local Schools has a system in place to increase academic growth, staff & student wellness, and community involvement. The system structure is formed by peer-to-peer networks, giving more people a voice and allowing for the inclusion of multiple perspectives in guiding our district's journey toward organizational learning and continuous improvement. Teacher-based teams (TBT) are organized by grade level and departments. They are designed to shift the focus from an individual teacher to a team of teachers who can function as a purposeful community. TBT's provide structured time for teachers to come together and review and revise the impact of teaching practice and student learning. Each building in our district has a Building leadership Team (BLT). The BLT is a school-based group of individuals who work to



provide a strong organizational process for school improvement. A rich variety of TBT members sit on the BLT. The final group is the District Leadership Team (DLT). Our DLT's purpose is to support instruction through data-minded goal setting, goal-centered professional development, and clear timely monitoring of progress. Goals have multiple components designed to make expectations explicit and provide a common focus for the district.

The District Leadership Team, Building Leadership Teams, and Teacher-based Teams focus on aligned strategies and action steps that will help achieve our academics growth, staff & student wellness, and community involvement goals. We are currently working toward revising our district and buildings' goals and strategies. We are committed to student and staff growth, wellbeing, and community involvement.

Tecumseh Local Schools will have a renewal levy on the November 2, 2021 ballot. The renewal is of an emergency levy that was originally passed in May of 1982. It generates approximately \$712,000 annually. The funds generated from this levy are used for normal operating expenses. The renewal levy will be for a period of five years - the same time period since it first passed. 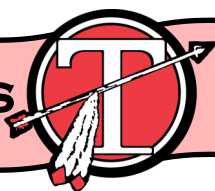
